

Summer Junior Dressage camp
Ashby Stock Farm
June 26 to July 1, 2017

This is a specialized training camp designed for children with a specific interest to compete in dressage.

The camp provides an opportunity for your child to explore the sport of dressage as well as learn more about the partnership they can create with their own horse or pony. The camp will provide theory and practical riding lessons, private and group. The children will also be coached in mental fitness, horsemanship, horse and rider fitness as well as competition.

This is a chance for children to meet other children that have the same passion as they do. The step by step of the levels as well as what is available in Region 8 and USDF will be discussed. The children/pony/junior and young rider divisions will be explained.

Nancy Lavoie will be the instructor. There will be mentors also available throughout the week.

This program is meant to help grow a foundation in Dressage enthusiasts that can be built on through the years toward junior and young rider competition. Children do not have to have the desire to compete at a high level in dressage to be welcomed into the camp. This camp will provide a good basic for all horse sports as well as good horsemanship.

Children can attend with their own leased or owned horse/pony, and may also apply to lease one of ours for the weekend.

Children under the age of 10 will be required to come as day participants as well as any children that are not experienced in sleeping away from home.

Things to bring: for your horse; hay, grain, shavings, tack, grooming equipment, any special supplements or medications as well as helpful information from your trainer.

Things to bring: for children; air mattress, bedding, pillow, towel, toiletries, allergy information, health insurance card, emergency numbers. Please do not bring a lot of sugary snacks ☺, cell phones must be turned off during all lessons and lectures and put on airplane mode at night.
